Did You Know?

From 1938 to 1940, Duncan High School won the boy's state basketball championship. In 1938 they beat Florence 24-23. In the 1939 game, Duncan won 25-17, with future editor of the *Copper Era* **Al Fenn** playing for Benson. The 1940 game was a 31-29 thriller over Tucson High, with All-State player **Gene O'Dell** making the winning basket at the buzzer. Since then, no other school in Arizona has won the boy's championship three years in a row.



Christmas Time

Christmas time in Duncan, Clifton, Morenci and Metcalf has always been a great time of year. This ad from the December 3, 1913 *Copper Era* for the Clifton Drug Store shows the variety of items available for gifts. Many of the stores stocked their shelves with a variety of items. Some items were even brought in



from out of state or even out of country, especially for the holiday season. In the early days of Clifton, a Christmas tree was set up in the park on the Eastside. The fountain area next to the Morenci Club was adorned by a Christmas tree in that city, with many generations of children enjoying a visit from Santa Claus. The highlight was receiving

a stocking filled with fruit and candy. Hobbs Hotel (today named Simpson Hotel) in Duncan hosted a grand ball every Christmas night for many years. In Metcalf, a dance was held with music provided by an orchestra from Clifton.
